The History of MAC



Established in 1968 at the height of the Civil Rights Movement, the "Task Force on Minority Youth Guidance" paved the path for AIChE's Minority Affairs Committee, and was the first engineering society to address this need. "No longer should extensive human resources go untapped because of artificial barriers or poor communicationsparticularly at a time when there is an increasing national need for scientific talents."

—from the committee's first position paper, accepted by the AIChE Council at its Tampa meeting on May 18, 1968
